Trial of a new statistically-based Top Ten System

Judges' Licensing:

New Policy: judges must submit a written explanation for any unfulfilled assignment.

New Judges' Seminar Program: guidelines were approved. This is a lengthy document, which I will have available at up-coming trials for review. When this goes into effect, each region will be required to host a seminar at least once every two years. We will need to consider this at our Annual Region 1 Meeting.

Long Range Planning:

Dog -friendly park development was discussed.

Vickie Jacobs was appointed "Convention Planner," to assist regions with ACOD planning.

Foundation: CEO, Jeff Lipps reported probably not feasible at this time.

Excellent Performance Award: given each year to a club which goes "above and beyond," this year to SLASH.

Constitutional Revisions, as published in the recent FAN Magazine: accepted.

Rules change proposals:

To allow buckle collars to be worn: failed.

To eliminate the Veteran Titles: failed.

"Housekeeping changes" to clarify language regarding Singles and Limited Stakes, and clarifying how excusals count: accepted.

Entry limit restrictions: accepted.

Provisional judging license to be granted after one publication: failed.

Requirement for attendance at a judging seminar before provisional licensing: failed. (This is interesting, as the Judging Seminar Guidelines and the program were accepted, but the requirement for attendance failed.)

Gary Forester Memorial Award: Kent and Marilyn Standerford.

Up-Coming ACODs:

2006 – Washington, DC area - Northern Virginia

2007 – Phoenix

2008 – Cleveland

Up-coming I.I.s:

2005 – Virginia

2006 – West Coast. Since no site was found in Region 1 or 2, Colorado is a possibility

Consideration of adding a new possible I.I. date, possibly in October, to allow more southern clubs to host during cooler weather.

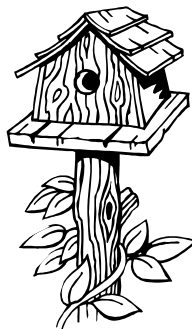
Hall of Fame:

**Old Business**: Judges Seminar: Guidelines go into effect as soon as minutes are published. Although the requirement for prospective judges' attendance did not pass, the first seminar will be held in August in Racine, Wisconsin.

**New Business**: REC directed to change wording in Rulebook to clarify the difference between Club Delegate Vs Convention Delegate. REC directed to shorten the time frame for granting provisional judges' license without requiring two publications. REC and Judges' Licensing directed to investigate requirement for apprentice and provisional judges, as well as licensed judges, to attend Judging Seminar(s). REC directed to investigate move-ups of hound placements in case of an ineligible hound entry. Board directed to investigate and evaluate how the Veteran Titles are working after three years, and their overall impact on entries. To report to ACOD next year. CS directed to send letter of appreciation to Judges Licensing Committee for their efforts in putting together the Judges' Seminar Guidelines. March 1 deadline for submission of names for the Mentor Judge List waived for 2005. Ad hoc committees were appointed. Judy Lange, Region 1 Director.

#### FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING:

**Protests**: Clubs Field Trial Secretaries **MUST** keep complete copies of Any protests filed and any follow-up and supporting documents. Originals are to be filed with ASFA.

**Dues and Membership Renewals**: Due May 1. **REMINDERS**: The form must name the club delegate but be signed by a club officer **OTHER THAN** the delegate or his spouse. The form must list the date of the club's last trial. "Guidelines for Hound Certifications" will be revised and soon available on the website. Meanwhile, I will have hard copies available at up-coming trials.

"Lure Coursing Promotion Packets" are available free to clubs thru the ASFA website. Contents: "Beginners Guide to Lure Coursing," "Sport of Lure Coursing", and FAN subscription cards. I urge each club to have these materials on hand at your trials for promotion and assisting newcomers.

PayPal Option for paying membership dues coming after April 15. This option will require a \$2.00 service charge, in addition to the \$50.00 annual dues.

Get your orders for trial supplies in early! You can order from the website. Trial forms, including record sheets and judges sheets. New rulebooks. You should provide new ones for your Field Committee members, and a few extras for sale to trial entrants.

From the Regional Directors Meeting:

Re judges for Regional Invitationals: must be regularly licensed for any breeds judges.

Re I.I. dates: a suggestion to add a possible October date to allow regions to host where weather is too warm in June is too warm to hold an I.I.

Huntmaster concerns:

When a hound does not run at the start of a course, the huntmaster **MUST** require the handler to retrieve his hound. The owner **MUST** comply. Huntmaster must inform the judge(s) of non-compliance; judge(s) may excuse the hound. Huntmaster MUST assure that each handler is using an acceptable slip lead or quick-release collar at the start line.

Animal Advisory: Liaison, Vickie Jacobs, requests that any club or coursers aware of any adverse animal legislation inform her, so it can be publicized and appropriate action(s) taken.

#### FROM THE ACOD:

**Treasurer's Report and 2005 Budget were presented.** ASFA is profitable and in good financial health at present. I will have copies of these available at up-coming trials for anyone to peruse.

**Regional Directors' Reports.** Other regions are having fun days combined with practices and certifications, lure operator and huntmaster training sessions, sharing tips on how to run a trial, regional treasuries and trophies, awards banquets. Scheduling: \$350 collected last year in late premium list fines! Let's not enrich ASFA's coffers this way. Heed the 45-day premium list submission deadline. Downloadable, editable sample Premium List coming soon.

Records: Trial data packet distributed; I will have this available for review at up-coming trials. Reminder to Field Trial Secretaries: you must require certification form and copy of registration with each first-time entry.

Regarding Protests: FTS must keep originals, provide the protestor with a copy, and forward to all else required. (See Rule Book, Chapter 9.)

Bear Right on Renton Three Tree Point Rd/Southcenter Blvd. Continue on Southcenter Blvd. Turn Right on 61st Ave S/Southcenter Blvd/Southcenter Pkwy. Turn Right on Southcenter Pkwy. The nearest cross street is Minkler Blvd.

**From I-5 North:** Take the Southcenter Parkway exit towards Tukwila, exit #153. Turn Right on Southcenter Pkwy. The nearest cross street is Minkler Blvd.
