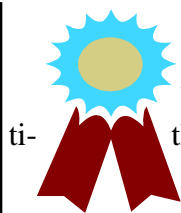

This is of the newsletter contains a list of the club sponsored awards as well as the criteria for the member sponsored awards.

If you are a club member who has sponsored an award, please review the criteria and make sure it is accurate as it will be officially open for application in the January newsletter. If you think there should be another type of award offered and would like to sponsor this award, please tell the President or officers the name of the award and the criteria that must be met as in the types of wins, location, etc. She will help you with that award and get it ready for publication in the January newsletter with the rest of the awards. In sponsoring an award, you will be the one who determines the winner along with the Awards Chairperson and will be responsible for acquiring a suitable gift or trophy. The application must have accompanying documentation of championship titles, race titles, names and points of offspring, etc. .

NWSGA PRACTICES

What: NWSGA box training and lure coursing practice. Straight runs only, adults and puppies, experienced and inexperienced hounds welcome; they will do our best to accommodate your needs. There will have a small whippet-sized two-hole box available for practice. Breeds smaller than whippets are welcome to use the boxes for training; larger breeds will be hand slipped only. All sighthounds, non-sighthounds and mixed breeds are welcome to participate in our practices.

When: December 4th, 10:00 a.m.
December 18th, 10:00 a.m.
January 8th, 10:00 a.m.
January 29th, 10:00 a.m.

(Practice runs will continue for as long as it takes to run each dog twice. There is no cut-off time for sign-ups, but please show up as early as possible. If you plan to arrive later than noon, please let me know in advance approximately what time you will arrive, so that we know to wait for you, within reason, in case of a light turnout. Please be considerate and understand that we just cannot wait around for you all day...)

Where: Frohning's Farm, regular practice field - just south of Monroe.
Unfenced field. Sorry, no restroom facilities. You must pick up after your dogs, and pack out all your own garbage, including dog poop. Directions below.

How much: \$4 per car (for the property owner) plus \$2 per dog (for NWSGA)

Directions to the field (there is a detailed map on our website: go to <http://www.nwsga.com> and click on 'Events & Schedules.')

FROM THE NORTH (I-5 Southbound), take exit 194 (US-2 to Snohomish/Wenatchee). Follow US-2 for approximately 15 miles to Monroe. Go under WA-522 and then turn right at the 2nd light onto Lewis Street/WA-203.

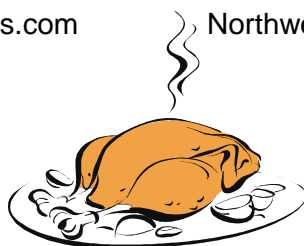
Go approximately 3 miles, and turn right onto 203rd St (just past the 'S' curves). Turn right at the stop sign onto Tualco Road. Take the first left onto Tualco Loop Rd. Go past the Fish & Wildlife parking area, past the farm house, and turn left at the Sky Valley Tractor Club sign. Follow the driveway back behind the barn and park on the gravel lot.

FROM THE SOUTH (I-405 Northbound), take exit 23 (WA-522 to Woodinville/Wenatchee). Follow WA-522 approximately 14 miles to Monroe, all the way to the end where 522 intersects with US-2. Turn left on US-2. At the 2nd light, turn right on Lewis Street/WA-203. Go approximately 3 miles, and turn right onto 203rd St (just past the 'S' curves). Turn right at the stop sign onto Tualco Road. Take the first left onto Tualco Loop. Go past the Fish & Wildlife parking area, past the farm house, and turn left at the Sky Valley Tractor Club sign. Follow the driveway back behind the barn and park on the gravel lot.

Annual Awards for 2005

for Western Washington Whippet Association

The Western Washington Whippet Association offers an Annual Award for each of the following titles achieved during the year beginning January 1st and ending December 31st

You may apply for as many awards as you qualify for, but you cannot win an award, if you do NOT apply.

AKC Champion

AKC Field Champion

AKC Obedience title

ASFA Field Champion or LCM

Racing Titles (NAWRA, WRA, CWA)

Foreign Champion

Foreign Field Title

Foreign Obedience Title

NOFCA Title

NOTRA Title



Rules governing Annual Award Competition:

1. To be eligible for an award, a member must be in good standing at the time the win is acquired.
2. Persons joining the club during the year, will be credited with wins made only during actual membership. Except for breeder awards, dogs must be owned or co-owned by a member at the time the title is achieved. For breeder awards, the owner of the dog does not have to be a club member, but the breeder must be a club member in order to receive the award.
3. Dogs must be owned, co-owned or bred by the member making the application for club awards.
4. Awards may be claimed for deceased dogs.
5. All titles must be verified by presentation of a copy of the certificate or proof of title issued by the kennel club or appropriate organization. This copy shall be attached to the application form. In the case of AKC awards, verification may be provided by the AKC Gazette (please include month & pg. number). Member sponsored awards will be verified by the donor of the award.
6. A separate form must be filed for each award, whether for the same or different dogs.
7. The Awards committee assumes no responsibility for distribution of the awards other than the official presentation. All club sponsored awards not claimed after 6 months, will become the property of the club. Individually sponsored awards will be returned to the donor if not claimed.

Member Sponsored Awards

Mary & Chris Downing (Whimsy Whippets) offers an award to the breeder of the whippets (at least 2) who acquire the most bench points, lure coursing points and obedience points during the calendar year. The dogs need not be owned by the breeder. They must take points in at least two of the three areas of competition. Points from AKC and CKC events to be compiled separately. Obedience points to be determined by the average of the 3 highest scores.

Susan & Chris Manthou (Bzantium Hounds) will offer an award for the club member-owned dog shown by the owner that acquires the most Best of Breed wins during the calendar year. At least half of the wins must be AKC wins. Ties to be determined by the number of dogs defeated during the year.

Doris Ringer (Ringo Whippets) offers an award to the club member-owned puppy who acquires the most AKC points before reaching 1 year of age. Ties to be determined first by major wins, then by the number defeated, then by age (younger over older).

Member Sponsored Awards (continued)

Christine Hopperstad (Alcyon Whippets) offers two awards to the Sire and Dam whose get and progeny acquire the most cumulative total AKC show points during the calendar year.

Helen Brettell (Lost Creek) offers an award for the top winning conformation Veteran whippet. This competition is open to all whippets 7 years and older. Point score is based on the number of whippets defeated by the veteran dog or bitch. Points must be gained by winning Veteran Dog or Veteran Bitch class, Best Veteran at a specialty, BOB or BOS. Only those whippets actually present and defeated shall be counted. Wins from licensed conformation shows in any country may be counted. Whippet must be owned and reside with a club member. If a whippet turns 7 during the course of the year, only those points gained after the birthday count toward this award. In the unlikely case of a tie, winner will be the oldest whippet.

Jeanette Dorsey (Treadway) offers an award to the club member owned dog who acquires the most Best of Breeds in the coursing field during the calendar year. Ties to be determined by the number of dogs defeated.

Charles Roberts (Strebor Kennel) offers a perpetual trophy to the club member owned dog who acquires the most ASFA points during the calendar year at **DRAG TRIALS ONLY**. The award is to be returned to the awards committee preceding the awards banquet each year. The trophy plates will be engraved with the dog's name by the recipient before its return. Ties to be determined by the number of dogs defeated, then by the number of first placements.

Arrow Perpetual Award

Pat Younger offers a sterling silver trophy bowl to the highest scoring obedience whippet from the Regular classes of AKC, UKC, CKC and foreign shows. The award is a perpetual one, and must be returned to WWA Awards Committee preceding the Awards Banquet.

1. Score is to be calculated from the total of the three (3) best scores achieved during the award (calendar) year. **a.** You cannot hook a leg from a previous year. You may, however, combine classes, e.g. two Novice scores with one Open score, etc. **b.** Ties will be broken by use of a fourth show's score. **c.** In case of an absolute tie, winner will be determined by the Awards Committee, which must confer with donor. **d.** All scores used must be qualifying scores.
2. The three scores must be from either AKC or CKC shows and cannot be intermixed. e.g., You cannot use two legs won in AKC with one won in Canada. You can, however, submit the two scores won in the same country, or club.
3. A dog can win with less than three scores. If a dog qualified only once or twice in the given calendar year, the scores will still apply to the awards. You do not have to submit three scores; however, if another dog is presenting three scores, your total obviously will be less. NOTE: It is very difficult to achieve three legs in any given calendar year, so odds of winning the trophy with fewer legs are reasonable. Obedience exhibitors should submit all scores.
4. Owner/handler must provide copies of AKC Gazette pages showing the score and show, etc., for verification. Proof of scores is the responsibility of the owner/handler.
5. Dogs must be handled by a member of WWA or their immediate family; the handler will keep the award. The whippet need not be owned by the handler. However, the trophy plates will be engraved in the dog's name.
